Benefit to Schools

- Submit Form 470 This can have an RFP attached or the 470 itself can act as an RFP which requires bids
- After 28 days a winning bid can be accepted and a form 471 is issued.
- Each application is then reviewed by the SLD's Program Integrity Assurance (PIA) team
- Funding is approved and the District issues a form 486 accepting the funding

E-Rate Process

 Discounts on Bills – Vendor/Provider receives reimbursement from SLD

 BEAR Form (Form 472) – District pays entire amount to vendor/provider and then receives reimbursement from SLD
